

Action on Climate Change in NB

- Current Action in NB focused on two fronts:
 - Mitigation reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.
 - Adaptation to the impacts of climate change; build resilience.
- 2014-2020 Action Plan:
 - Mitigation and adaption; sustaining economic growth.
 - Substantive regulatory, policy and fiscal measures were not included.

Climate Change in New Brunswick

Warmer

- Increased risk of heat-health fatalities.
- New pests and invasive species.

Wetter

Increased risk of flood damage.

Stormier

- Impacts from extreme winds trees, power.
- Icing and associated damage.

Rising sea levels

Increased risk of flooding and coastal erosion.

Increased risk to communities, infrastructure & natural resources
